A.I. in China (and everywhere)

The replacement of humans with machines is usually driven by factors such as increases in productivity, efficiency and a lack of labor. The idea of China, "the world's workshop" making an early switch to non-human processes seems premature since the country appears to have an endless supply of humans to manage manufacturing work.

But that assumption may be fading fast, China is as progressive in its use of artificial intelligence as anywhere. This informative article in the South China Morning Post details some of the advances already being used: schools encourage parents to download "tutoring" apps to their phones to support school lessons; automatic traffic control adjusts to the actual cars on the road; chips in public surveillance cameras analyze facial recognition to find missing children; and an "AI judge" has been tested to analyze legal documents, just like in my last book *The Probable Cause*.

All of these advances are based on the computer's ability to "learn" and put into practice responses a human would take much longer to process. In the Life Online books, this is the foundation of The Network. Of course the drama comes when we humans are not exactly sure what the machine has been learning.

Cyber threats in Smart Cities

Smart cities are the glittering steel, glass, and green urban centers going up all over the developing world. And while most people associate cyber security threats to the stealing of credit card numbers, these high-tech and inter-connected populated areas face an even more daunting challenge. The cities do not yet have viable security blankets covering their hoped for "smart" living functions.

The most dramatic fears come from ideas such as self-driving cars suddenly running off the road, or automatic health care providers failing to continue patient care. But as <u>this article in Arab News</u> explains, because these breaches have yet to happen, there is little incentive to implement expensive security features.

The challenge will come when the majority of the world's people are living in these types of cities and we have to backtrack to retroactively implement security. By then, the options to safely protect the population will likely be limited.

Travelers alert: E-surveillance over you

In prior newsletters, I have flagged an issue for travelers when countries adopt more stringent electronic surveillance measures than your home country. The verdict is your face, data and movements are caught on camera, processed into a file, and available whenever someone decides to look for you.

Travelers will have no recourse when they take their mobile phones and other devices into countries that impose surveillance regulations that may compromise personal privacy. This article in the Africa Report about Nigeria's efforts to enhance esurveillance is another example.

As a global traveler, I will be keeping track of these developments. I imagine in the future, before you travel you will not only check visa requirements for a foreign country but also their privacy and surveillance rules.

Okay those are the latest real world developments I have been tracking to stay on top of future tech changes. Soon we'll be making adjustments to our "lives right now" to be prepared for our future Life Online.
